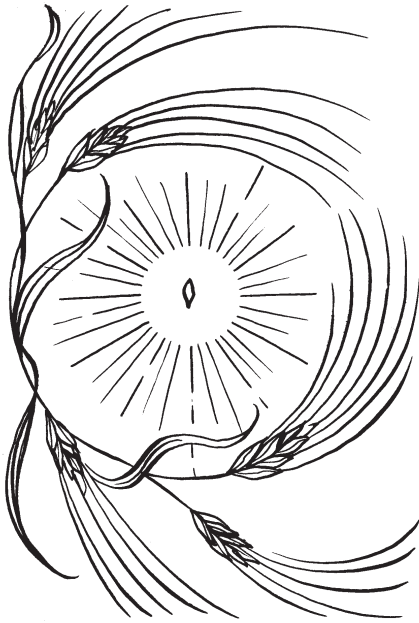

FIRST READING

Jeremiah 31:31-34






